

Red Thread

Red thread is one of the most common lawn diseases in Pennsylvania and is Red to pink and thread like in appearance.

It develops when the air temperatures are between 65° to 75°F, with prolonged periods of rainy and humid weather usually in the late spring and early summer.

In most situations, red thread is not severe enough to warrant treatment and will almost always resolve on it own. Once the weather conditions become dryer and warmer, red thread will begin to turn brown and grow out with mowing leaving no visible damage or lasting scars in your lawn.
